California Grape Growers Award Scholarships

Fresno, CA – Students in California's grape growing regions have been awarded scholarships to help them attend college, thanks to table grape growers.

Seven field worker scholarships were awarded in 2016: three \$20,000 four-year field worker scholarships, two \$3,500 two-year scholarships to community colleges, and a onetime, Martin J. Zaninovich \$20,000 four-year field worker scholarship. Also, three \$20,000 four-year agricultural scholarships were awarded in 2016.

Here are the 2016 scholarship recipients:

\$20,000 Four-year Field Worker Scholarships



Ms. Andrea Marin-Contreras is a graduate of Riverdale High School with a weighted GPA of 4.03. Andrea plans to attend University of California, San Diego and major in English, with a career goal of becoming a writer or journalist. Andrea was a member of the honor roll at her school, a member of the varsity basketball team and taught catechism to younger

children at her local church. Her mother, Carmen Contreras, worked for Sandridge Partners in Corcoran in the 2015-16 season.



Ms. Guadalupe Melgoza-Ortiz plans to attend Cal Poly Pomona to major in mathematics and has a career goal of becoming a pediatrician.
